What is the most ingenious or creative excuse you have heard someone give in an attempt to avoid responsibility? How did Pilate attempt to evade any responsibility in the condemnation of Jesus? (27:24) What ironic statement did the crowd make about Jesus' blood? (27:25) What happened to the two prisoners—Barabbas and Jesus? (27:26)
